Many heating and cooling problems can be repaired quickly and affordably, especially if your equipment is relatively new.

A repair is often the best choice when:

Your System Is Less Than 10 Years Old

Modern HVAC systems are built to last 15–20 years when properly maintained. If your equipment is still in the first half of its lifespan, repairing it is usually the most economical option.

The Repair Is Minor

Issues such as replacing a capacitor, contactor, thermostat, blower motor, igniter, or fan motor are common repairs that can often restore your system without requiring replacement.

Your Utility Bills Are Stable

You should begin considering replacement if:

Your System Is 12–15 Years Old or Older

If you're calling for repairs every summer or winter, those repair bills begin adding up quickly. Multiple repairs within a short period often indicate the system is reaching the end of its useful life.
